Monoichi Kodaimae Sta.

The stone monument marks the historical site of the mansion of the Togashi Clan, who used to rule the Kaga Province.

2 Nunoichi Shrine

Dedicated to Sugawara no Michizane, also known as the "god of learning", this shrine is believed to be established by the Togashi Clan of the Kaga Province.

The stone monument called "Benkei's power stone" still remains today. The magnificent ginkgo tree that towers over the precincts of the shrine is estimated to be 500 years old.

③ Kita Family House (Designated National Important Cultural Property)

A refined wooden structure that retains the architectural beauty of traditional Japanese house from the Edo period. It was also a sake brewery that produced various kinds of renowned sake such as "Shoiyo" for over 100 years. Enjoy the view of an open tatami room with a beautifully patterned hearth and an elegant garden.

If you need good luck... pray for success at Nunoichi Shrine


