If you love sake... come taste the local sake “Shojyo”

Once a renowned sake produced at Kita Family House half a century ago, Shojyo has been revived using the surviving yeast from the house, as well as “gohyakumangoku” rice from Nonoichi’s rice fields and subterranean water from the foot of Mt.Hakusan. The sweet, yet refreshing taste is perfect for any dish. Please have a taste at the café in Local Museum Nono.

If you like history...pay a visit to Nunoichi Shrine

Nunoichi Shrine is associated with the Togashi Clan that once ruled the Kaga Province, and well-known for the Kabuki play “Kanjincho”. A stone monument called “Benkei’s power stone”, supposedly thrown all the way from Togashi Clan’s mansion, remains in the precincts of the shrine. Fugakudo’s “Monaka Kanjincho” shaped after Benkei’s scroll is also popular as a lucky charm for overcoming difficulties.

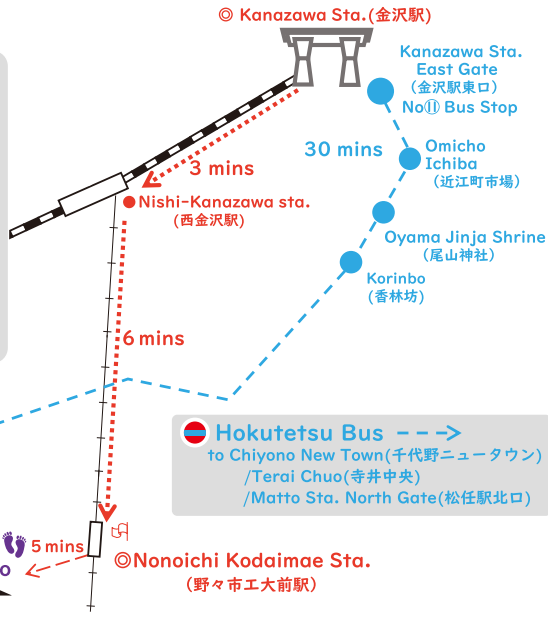

① Nonoichi Chuo Bus Stop

Look for the camellia monument. It was selected for the Ishikawa Hyakumangoku Cultural Festival "100 Artworks I found"



Let's head to Camino, the hub of your trip

② Nonoichi Kodaimae Sta.

The stone monument marks the historical site of the mansion of the Togashi Clan, who used to rule the Kaga Province.



③ Nunoichi Shrine

Dedicated to "Sumiyoshi Sanjin" (the three Shinto deities of the sea), this shrine is believed to be established by the Togashi Clan of the Kaga Province.

Have a look at the monument inscribed with a poem composed by Shogoin Doko when he stopped by Nonoichi, and the statue of the guardian dog standing on its front legs.

The magnificent ginkgo tree that towers over the precincts of the shrine is estimated to be 500 years old.



④ Kita Family House (Designated National Important Cultural Property)

A refined wooden structure that retains the architectural beauty of traditional Japanese house from the Edo period. It was also a sake brewery that produced various kinds of renowned sake such as "Shojo" for over 100 years. Enjoy the view of an open tatami room with a beautifully patterned hearth and an elegant garden.

Start here if you are driving or taking a taxi

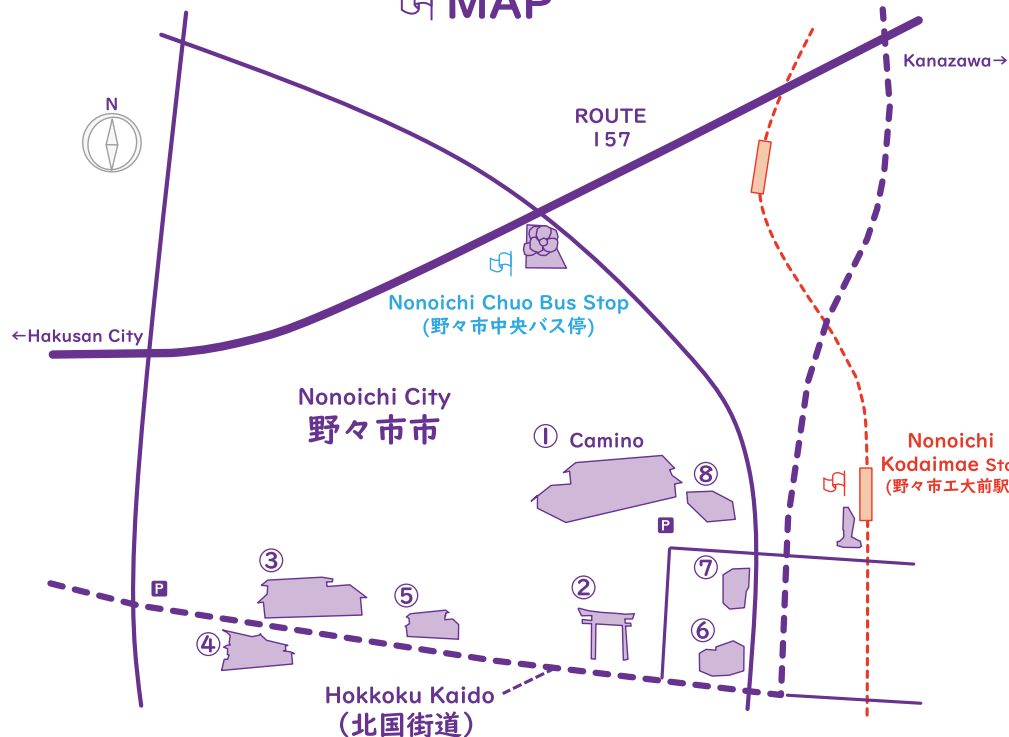
Restrooms and nursing room available. Perfect for a break. You can also rent a bicycle (200 Yen/2 hours).

The most popular sweet, "Monaka Kanjincho" that looks like Benkei's scroll is a good-luck charm. The cake is filled with green tea bean paste and walnuts.

The renowned "Tsubaki Manju" has sweet red bean paste wrapped in delicious dough kneaded with yam.
